Stewardship" is a translation of the Greek word oikonomia, from which we obtain the word "economy." Literally, the term refers to the "management of the household." In Orthodox theology, "economy" also refers to God's management of His creation, and specifically His plan for the salvation of the world through the Incarnation of His Son.

St. Paul describes the divine economy in this way: For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich (2 Corinthians 8:9, New King James Version). The Apostle describes how God's example should encourage us to also be generous in our giving for the needs of others and the work of God's Church. In 2 Corinthians chapter 9, St. Paul writes:

⁶ But this I say: He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work. ⁹ As it is written: He has dispersed abroad, He has given to the poor; His righteousness endures forever.

¹⁰ Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your

righteousness, ¹¹ while you are enriched in everything for all liberality, which causes thanksgiving through us to God. ¹² For the administration of this service not only supplies the needs of the saints, but also is abounding through many thanksgivings to God, ¹³ while, through the proof of this ministry, they glorify God for the obedience of your confession to the gospel of Christ, and for your liberal sharing with them and all men, ¹⁴ and by their prayer for you, who long for you because of the exceeding grace of God in you. ¹⁵ Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!

In January, the Parish Assembly approved a budget of \$250,500 for St. Mary's for calendar year 2013. Between January 1 and March 29, 2013, the Parish Council has spent \$66,536 in ordinary expenses, which equals 96 percent of our budget this far through the year. We have received \$53,057 in regular income over the same period, of which \$40,015 were weekly contributions not designated for specific purposes. This means that we have an operating deficit of \$13,479 as we near the end of the first quarter of 2013, although we expect March 31 offerings to reduce this deficit somewhat. The Parish Council will take any remaining deficit into account when making spending decisions for the remainder of the year.

As we focus during our Lenten journey on all that our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ has given "for us and for our salvation," let us remember to be generous in giving of our time, talent, and treasure to Christ's work today through His Church. Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!
